The start dates for winter and spring sessions are also listed, so you can plan your availability for upcoming classes. Please remember that in order to efficiently schedule classes and instructors, we need to have a firm registration date of one week before classes start. Generally, a class will not be held unless we have a minimum number of students registered. In order to hold down costs, our chapter DOES NOT accept American Express credit cards. All other forms of payment are accepted.

A new service that we have added this year is providing classes to non-members. Previously, everyone who desired to take education courses had to become an APICS member. Non-members can now take classes for \$75.00 above the member cost per class. In order to take CPIM certification tests, you must be an APICS member.

Holding seven courses requires a lot of work from our Board of Directors and our instructors. I would like to thank each of them for their continued hard work in bringing this together. One constraint that we face is not having enough class locations throughout the city, especially on the Southeast side of town. If your company has a training room that is available, e-mail me at president@apics-col.org. I can offer a year's membership or one free class registration as an incentive.

I look forward to seeing everyone at the Professional Development Meeting on September 17th. We have scheduled a tour of ISP Fine Chemicals starting at 6:00 PM, followed by dinner at Salvi's Bistro. Education Program – Fall 2002 to Spring 2003

CPIM Certification Review Courses:

All five modules (Basics of Supply Chain Management, Master Planning of Resources, Detailed Scheduling and Planning, Execution and Control of Operations and Strategic Management of resources - will be offered three times, Fall, Winter and Spring. These courses are an excellent review for those seeking the CPIM designation. There are no grades issued for these courses.

Fundamentals Courses:

There are four courses in this series – Inventory Control, Planning, Manufacturing Control and Operations Management. Two courses in this series will be offered each session – Fall, Winter and Spring. The Fundamentals courses are excellent for gaining points for recertification (36 points) and provide a suitable academic background for those needing to acquaint themselves with the manufacturing and materials management processes. These classes are rigorous and consist of case studies, mid-term and final exam. A grade is issued in addition to the certificate.

CIRM Certification Review Courses:

These will be scheduled per demand. A minimum of six is needed to start a class. Schedule dates will mirror those of the CPIM.

Certificates of completion are issued to all students completing the courses

NEW FEATURES:

A cut off date has been established for each class session. Prior registration is required to allow for proper scheduling of materials, class and instructors. No walk-in registration. Also the students along with the instructor will have the option to reschedule the number of classes and hours of each session – it must be unanimous – as long as a minimum of 16 hours of instruction for the CPIM and 25 hours for Fundamentals are held. If the entire course material is not covered, additional classes will be scheduled. This will allow the classes to progress as to the capacity of the students and allow for more flexibility in everyone's personal schedule. Also you will not be required to become a member of APICS to participate in the classes. There will be separate member and non-member fees.
