About the Guest Speaker

Jonathan Dove joined Worthington Industries in December of 1998 as the Chief Information Officer, overseeing all aspects of Information Management for the company. Worthington Industries is the country's leading intermediate steel processor and a leading manufacturer of metals related products, with annualized sales of approximately \$2 billion. Worthington Industries employs over 8,000 people and operates 65 facilities in 10 countries.

Prior to joining Worthington Industries, Jonathan was Senior Vice President of Alltel. At Alltel, he established the Strategic Technology Services division, focusing on providing professional services to Alltel's customers. Mr. Dove developed expertise in program and project management as senior project manager at Electronic Data Systems, Inc. He also acted as the first IT Director for a new business venture in Personal Communications Services, responsible for the overall development and project management of its new IT infrastructure.

Mr. Dove serves on the statewide steering committee for E-Com Ohio and the Olentangy School District Technical Advisory Committee. He also is a member of the Board of Directors of Easter Seals. Most recently, he was on the Steering Committee and served as a Track Chair for the Inaugural Central Ohio CIO Symposium.

CPIM Certification Review Courses:

All five modules (Basics of Supply Chain Management, Master Planning of Resources, Detailed Scheduling and Planning, Execution and Control of Operations and Strategic Management of resources - will be offered three times, Fall, Winter and Spring. These courses are an excellent review for those seeking the CPIM designation. There are no grades issued for these courses.

Fundamentals Courses:

There are four courses in this series – Inventory Control, Planning, Manufacturing Control and Operations Management. Two courses in this series will be offered each session – Fall, Winter and Spring. The Fundamentals courses are excellent for gaining points for recertification (36 points) and provide a suitable academic background for those needing to acquaint themselves with the manufacturing and materials management processes. These classes are rigorous and consist of case studies, mid-term and final exam. A grade is issued in addition to the certificate.

CIRM Certification Review Courses:

These will be scheduled per demand. A minimum of six is needed to start a class. Schedule dates will mirror those of the CPIM.

Certificates of completion are issued to all students completing the courses

NEW FEATURES:

A cut off date has been established for each class session. Prior registration is required to allow for proper scheduling of materials, class and instructors. No walk-in registration. Also the students along with the instructor will have the option to reschedule the number of classes and hours of each session – it must be unanimous – as long as a minimum of 16 hours of instruction for the CPIM and 25 hours for Fundamentals are held. If the entire course material is not covered, additional classes will be scheduled. This will allow the classes to progress as to the capacity of the students and allow for more flexibility in everyone's personal schedule. Also you will not be required to become a member of APICS to participate in the classes. There will be separate member and non-member fees.
