In today's increasingly competitive business environment, more and more we see manufacturing organizations initiate programs and projects designed to reduce costs, improve customer response time, improve overall product quality and reduce inventory all at the same time. In addition the needs of the workforce have to be taken into consideration to develop and maintain a stable experienced work unit

One of the most recent attempts used in manufacturing has been the application of lean manufacturing techniques: both a simple and complex process that requires dedication, follow up and a continuous drive to involve all personnel levels in the organization.

Mr. Tanner will discuss the following:

- How his organization evolved into the process
- The struggles and roadblocks along the way toward implementation
- The benefits derived from successful completion.

CPIM Certification Review Courses:

All five modules (Basics of Supply Chain Management, Master Planning of Resources, Detailed Scheduling and Planning, Execution and Control of Operations and Strategic Management of Resources) will be offered three times - Fall, Winter and Spring. These courses are an excellent review for those seeking the CPIM designation. There are no test or grades issued for these courses, only a certificate of Completion.

Fundamentals Courses:

This curriculum will be schedules as demand arises. A minimum of seven students must be enrolled to start a session. Schedule dates will be determined during enrollment to satisfy both students and instructor.

CIRM Certification Review Courses:

This curriculum will be schedules as demand arises. A minimum of six students must be enrolled to start a session. Schedule dates will be determined during enrollment to satisfy both students and instructor.

Accelerated CPIM Review Courses:

The accelerated program - three Saturdays - will be offered in the summer session as in the previous year and one course each term if demand justifies holding a course and a suitable facility allowing use on Saturdays can be found.

Program Features:

- A cut-off date has been established for each class session. Prior registration is required to allow for scheduling class materials, locations and instructors. **No walk in registration.**
- **Flex Classes - the students and the instructors can vary the class length and number of meetings as long as it is unanimous and a minimum of 16 hours for CPIM and all course material is satisfactorily covered.**
- You do not have to be an APICS member to take the class; there are separate fees for members and non-members.
