Dr. Hansen is an active Business Analyst with twenty years experience working on the design/redesign requirements for a wide range of products, processes, services and organizational structures. He has worked with enterprise analysis and elicitation of requirements on projects related to human services, strategic planning, inter-organizational collaboration, education, training, international development, socioeconomic planning, program development, funding, IT systems, IT security, corporate mergers and professional development.

This work has brought Dr. Hansen to over thirty countries, where he has been involved with all levels of society, in many cultures. While bilingual in English and Spanish, he has also facilitated processes in languages and cultures that he is less familiar with. His perspective is that all Business Analysis is multicultural, by the very nature of our own natural diversity as people, and he approaches every situation from that perspective.

Through his work with needs assessment and business analysis, he has been able to create a community college, various nonprofit and for-profit organizations, as well as many programs and organizational processes. In the field of Information Technology, he has contributed to the development of many solutions for organizational information needs.

Dr. Hansen has been a member of the International Institute of Business Analysis (IIBA) since 2005 and served on the first IIBA Endorsed Education Provider (EEP) Committee. He became a Certified Business Analysis Professional (CBAP) in 2007. His efforts in 2005-06 led to the sponsorship and formalization of the Columbus IIBA Chapter, of which he is a member.

Dr. Hansen has a profound background in Needs Assessment theory and practice and has contributed research, leadership and presentations to the field. He has developed unique requirement elicitation and analysis methods that have been used world-wide to create consensus in challenging and devisive requirements settings. His doctorate is in the field of education. In addition to his CBAP certification, he is also certified by the Project Management Institute (PMI) as Project Management Professional (PMP).

The many organizations that he has worked with as a consultant include; UNICEF, Organization of American States (OAS), Pan-American Development Foundation (PADF), United States Agency for International Development (USAID) United State Peace Corps, USDA Grad School, United States Americorps, Ashland University, Antioch McGregor University, Rabhani Baha’l School of Gwalior, India, Harry T. Fultz Albanian-American Educational Foundation, Government of Albania Cabinet of Ministers, the Guaymi Tribe, in Boca de Remedio, Panama and the Energy Regulatory Regional Association (ERRA) of the CIS countries in Eurasia.
